### JUNE CHALLENGE

June will quickly be here, and this year's challenge is based on a photo of Gretchen Lang's backyard. The only requirement is that the colors of your project match the colors of the landscape depicted. Looks like we will be seeing blues ranging from light to dark, purples, browns and tans and of course a range of greens from yellowy to blue-green.

The beautiful greens now "springing" forth should be an inspiration to begin, if you haven't already, to design your challenge quilt.

There will be two \$25 prizes: one for the most beautiful and one for the most creative interpretation of the photo. Everyone will vote in each category. Don't write your name on the front of the quilt, though I'm sure some of us will recognize our members' distinctive styles.

### JUNE CHALLENGE - COLOR PALATE

Sue McKenna to inspire me to get started on my June

challenge project gave me an article entitled, "Finding Your Inner Artist." Once you've found her, you are ready to execute your inspirations in the real world.

Think of your stash as a giant Crayola box with 296 crayons with a built in sharpener - a really deluxe set. Select the following crayons and line them up on your worktable with a coffee cup at each end to keep them from falling off.

amber, auburn, beige, brick, cream, buff, russet, saddle, umber, tawny, bronze, chestnut, ecru, cinnamon, cocoa, gold, khaki, natural, sand, fawn, ginger, suntan, biscuit, BROWN, bay, coffee, copper, hazel, henna, mahogany, nut, ochre, puce, rust, sepia, sorrel, russet, terracotta, toast, aqua, azure, cerulean, gentian, indigo, mazarin, periwinkle, BLUE, royal, navy, teal, turquoise, ultramarine, cobalt, beryl, sapphire, emerald, apple, GREEN, chartreuse, forest, jade, Kelly, lime, malachite, pine, sage, verdigris, moss, amaranthine, amethyst, heliotrope, lavender, lilac, PURPLE, magenta, mauve, mulberry, lilac, orchid, perse, plum, pomegranate, violet, wine

Now there's no excuse for not starting to draw your project. You've got the colors. I can't wait to see the finished drawing.

### PRESIDENT'S BLOCK

Each year, as members of the Kenan Quilters' Guild, we make our outgoing President the block of her choice. This year, Martha would like **blue and white** blocks that finish to 9" square (a block should measure 9 1/2" when you have completed it, 9" when put together in a quilt). The block that you make can be any pattern (pieced or applique), but it must be blue (any shade) and **white**. They will be presented to her at the June picnic.
